## Summer Reading Program has Something for Everyone

As the weather heats up, the Douglas Library's Summer Reading Program kicks off with opportunities to have fun, win prizes, and stay cool this summer. The program runs from June 27 through August 26 and all age groups can participate. Adults and teens can play Summer Reading Bingo, where entrants make lines by completing various tasks and challenges. Each line gets the player a prize and an entry into the grand prize drawings. Children who read for 20 minutes each day can fill out a reading log and take it to the library once a week to get a stamp, a prize, and an entry into the grand prize drawings. Bingo sheets and reading logs will be available in the library and online beginning in mid-June.

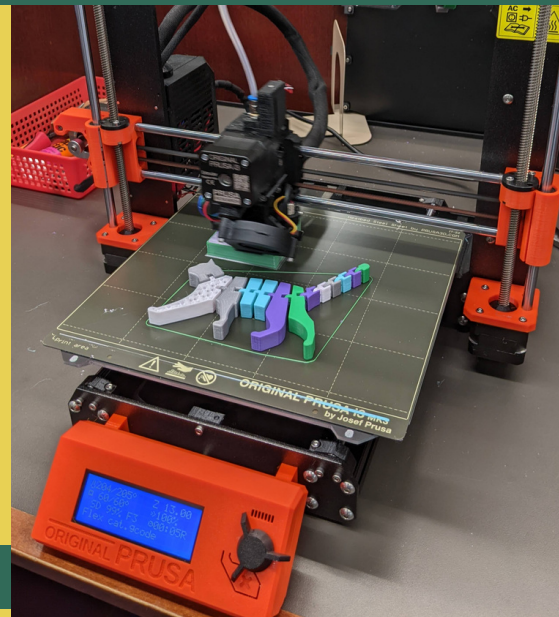


### Spirited Book Club

Lots of great movies this month! Join us at 1PM each week to watch a flick and have some snacks in our Community Room. Reservations are not required.

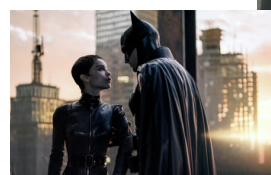

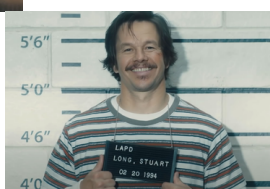

**June 21** - Teen Gaming Club. Enjoy some multiplayer Switch action.

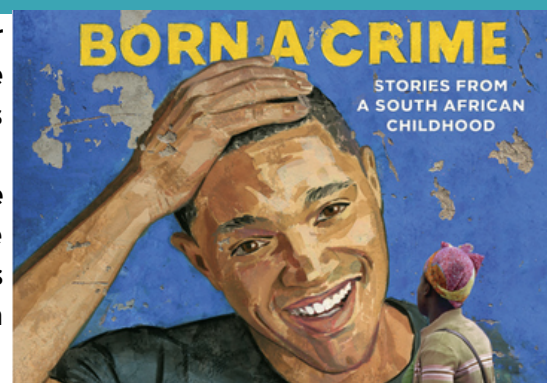
