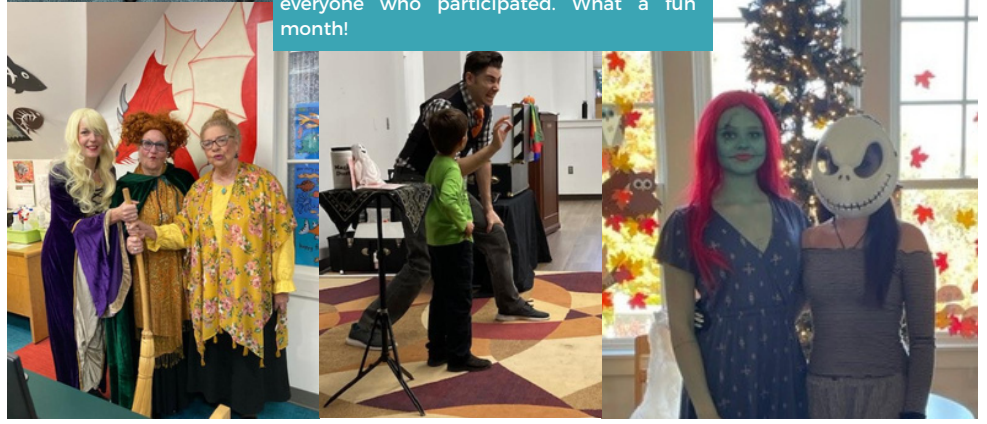
## Reading earns kids treats at Flour Girl Bakery
