Set-up and take-down volunteers will be needed.

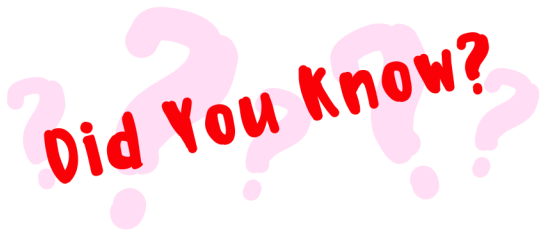
March 16 & 17 - MapleFest
